RCA STUDENT APPOINTED TO PRESTIGIOUS SENATE PAGE POSITION

Riverside Christian Academy student, Lauren Fielding, has received the prestigious honor of being appointed as Senator Bob Corker's Senate Page for the Spring 2018 semester.

Senate pages come from all 50 states. They are appointed and sponsored by a senator, they must be high school juniors, at least 16-years-old, and attend school. Senate page duties consist primarily of delivery of correspondence and legislative material within the Congressional complex. Other duties include preparing the chamber for Senate sessions, and carrying bills and amendments to the desk. Pages attend classes in the early morning at the United States Senate Page School, a program fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

The application process for Senate Page positions is rigorous. Students must complete a resume and an extensive application, send in their high school transcripts, participate in phone interviews with Senate staff members, and provide several professional references and letters of recommendation.

Lauren's page program will begin in late January and go through early June. Lauren is no stranger to Washington, D.C. Over the summer she spent a week at the Washington Journalism and Media Conference at George Mason University where she learned from professionals in many different areas of journalism including: broadcast, print, and online communication. Lauren also serves on the RCA Student Council, is a member of the Junior's House Child Advocacy Board and the National Honor Society, and is a varsity cheerleader.
