We are so very excited to announce a new dual enrollment partnership with Freed-Hardeman University. We are striving and providing the very best academic opportunities for our beloved students here at RCA.

32 HOURS OF FREE COLLEGE CREDIT

We will be able to offer 32 hours of college credit for free to our Tennessee students and reduce the cost of dual enrollment college credit for our Alabama students by half. We began this process many months ago by meeting with different universities. Freed-Hardeman stood out for several reasons. They have already established dual enrollment in both private and public schools to great success. We personally met with members of the Freed-Hardeman administration including President David Shannon and followed up with schools currently in the dual enrollment program, who provided positive feedback on their incredible program.

"The opportunity for RCA students to take up to 10 tuition-free courses really helps them jump-start their college careers," Jared Gott, FHU director of emerging and innovative programs, said. "We are excited to partner with RCA and to contribute to the success of their graduates."

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

Dr. Rushing and the Board have finalized an agreement with Freed-Hardeman University to expand dual enrollment classes for high school students that will provide benefits unlike any other offerings that are currently available. As an additional part of this partnership, RCA will also be participating in leading-edge, university-level research to develop and incorporate best practices into our classrooms at all levels and to provide innovative professional development for our teachers.

Finally, as part of the "what-if" portion of our vision, we are working with a landscape engineering company to develop a long-term site plan so that future growth and campus development can be accomplished in a way that is efficient and thoughtful. This plan can be used to show potential donors what the RCA vision for the future looks like. Hopefully, by showing that there has been prayerful, thoughtful, strategic planning, those opportunities can become a reality!

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STEM PROGRAM COMING TO RCA & ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Riverside Christian Academy's administration is excited to announce that a new STEM program is in the works for the school. Many parents have expressed an interest in more opportunities in this area. Currently, Dr. Rushing and the middle and high school science teachers are researching different programs to determine the most viable and effective for RCA. We look forward to having this program ready for the 2023-2024 school year.

Since RCA has begun the first phase of implementing a STEM program, we are spotlighting an alum who is gaining great experience at the collegiate level in biomedical research. Lauren Fielding is a 2019 graduate of RCA who attends Freed-Hardeman University; she is currently getting ready for a summer research internship in biomedical and molecular sciences led by Dr. Joe Deweese.



Dr. Deweese earned his Ph.D. in biochemistry from Vanderbilt University in 2009. He taught for Lipscomb University College of Pharmacy for 12 years in the areas of biochemistry, molecular biology, and anticancer pharmacology. During that time, he maintained an active research laboratory focusing on DNA topoisomerases and anticancer pharmacology. He now serves as Professor of Biochemistry and Director of Undergraduate Research for FHU.

"The Biomedical and Molecular Sciences Summer Research Program is an opportunity for students to engage in focused research. Students will be working with me on projects that I have been pursuing over the last few years. Our research focuses on human DNA topoisomerase II, which is an important enzyme in our cells that also is a cancer drug target," said Dr. Deweese.

Lauren hopes to gain experience in various processes that are commonly used in research. "I hope to acquire the skills to interpret gel electrophoresis or a relaxation assay, and to gain more clarity for determining what path I want to take after graduation from Freed-Hardeman," said Lauren.

Currently, Lauren is weighing her options for different career paths upon college graduation. She has considered medical school or obtaining a PhD in chemistry in order to continue in the field of research.

"One characteristic that I grew in because of my time at RCA was the ability to collaborate. RCA is such a close knit community and prior to attending Riverside, I had not experienced anything like it. People genuinely care about others around them. Peers and teachers alike will work with you in order for you to do your best. I got used to working with people and that was a skill I'm so glad I had as I entered college. Classes such as Chemistry and Anatomy & Physiology have given me the foundation necessary to thrive in my classes at Freed-Hardeman," said Lauren.

"FHU provides solid training in science and pre-health professions. Our professors aim to model living as a Christian while also being scientists. We help students learn to interpret the evidence found by science in the context of a biblical framework. We try to wrestle with hard questions while remaining grounded in scripture. Above all, we hope to communicate humility and the recognition that many questions we may not be able to answer, but we can trust in God and His Word," said Dr. Deweese.

The path from Riverside to a private Christian university is a seamless one for many RCA graduates including Lauren, and RCA's administration is striving to make the transition to college even smoother with the addition of the new STEM program and the FHU partnership for dual enrollment courses.

We also honored Cara & Paul Sain for their many years of dedication to the ministry of RCA.


